COVID-19 Cases in Minnesota

As of May 14, 2020, there have been **13,435** total positive cases of Coronavirus Disease 2019 in the State of Minnesota. **1,605** of the total positive cases in Minnesota have been from health care workers. There have been **663** total deaths within the state due to COVID-19. There have been **1,915** total cases who have required hospitalization. **8,473** cases of patients who have no longer needed to be isolated.

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Stay at Home MN until May 18th



Stay SAFE MN Beginning May 18th

- Beginning on May 18th, **Retail stores, malls and other main street businesses can reopen** if they have a safety plan and operate at no more than 50 percent occupancy.
 - *Restaurants, bars, salons and gyms remain closed.*
- Minnesotans may gather with friends and family in groups of 10 people or less.
 - *Social, civic, community, faith-based, leisure or religious gatherings are prohibited for groups over 10 people.*
- Continue to follow these safe practices:
 - Wash your hands often
 - Get tested if experiencing symptoms
 - Maintain social distance of 6 feet from another person
 - Wear a mask
 - Stay home when able and Stay home when you are sick!
