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	<ul> <li>IF you have respiratory disease symptoms such as: fever (100.4 or above), coughing, shortness of breath; you should stay home and isolate yourself for at least 7 days and for 3 days with no fever and improvement of the respiratory symptoms, whichever is longer. Your fever should be gone for 3 days without fever-reducing medication. Some patients have had additional symptoms including muscle aches, headache, sore throat or diarrhea.</li> <li>At this time, not everyone with respiratory symptoms will be tested.</li> <li>Call your health care provider before you go in if your symptoms worsen.</li> <li>If someone in your household has tested positive for Coronavirus Disease 2019, keep the ENTIRE household at home         <ul> <li>Household members should stay home for 14 days as well.</li> <li>Separate the infected individual from others in the home. Use separate bathrooms, if available</li> <li>Avoid sharing personal household items such as dishes, drinking glasses, cups, etc.</li> <li>Clean all frequently touched surfaces in your home daily such as doorknobs and light switches, etc.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Put distance between yourself and others (within 6 feet for 10 minutes or more)</li> </ul>
