Combined with ten other counties we conducted a survey funded through SHIP. When going through the data collected it was obvious a few pockets of culture groups were clearly unrepresented. It was decided that having these focus groups would be the best way to obtain information because historically these cultures don't respond to surveys very much. There was five different focus groups held for the following groups: Latinos, Somali, American Indian, and two Hmong. Ann then went over some of the data given to the Board in their monthly packets. Orren was pleased with the amount of participants that showed up and that they really opened up and shared come personal stories.
